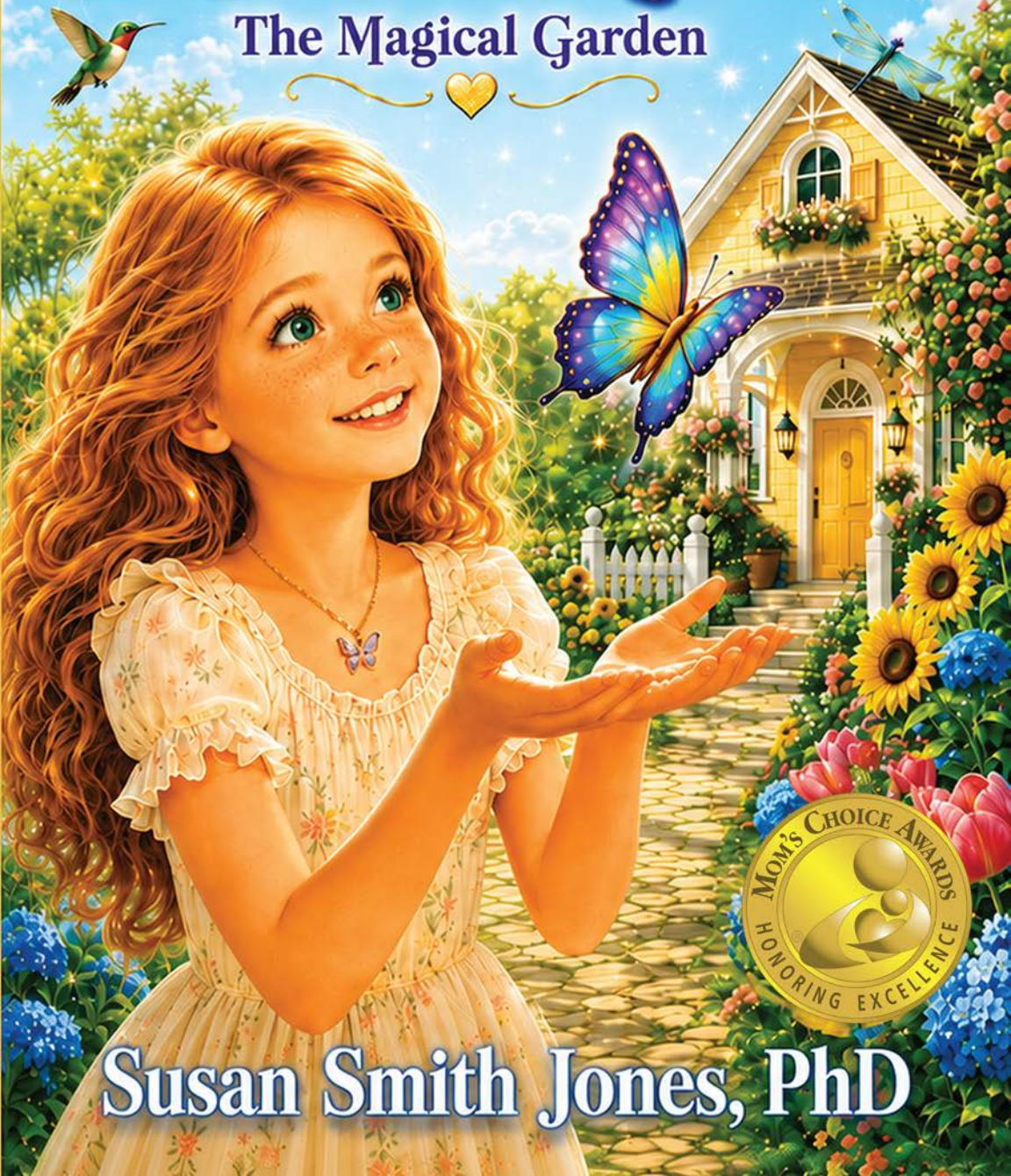

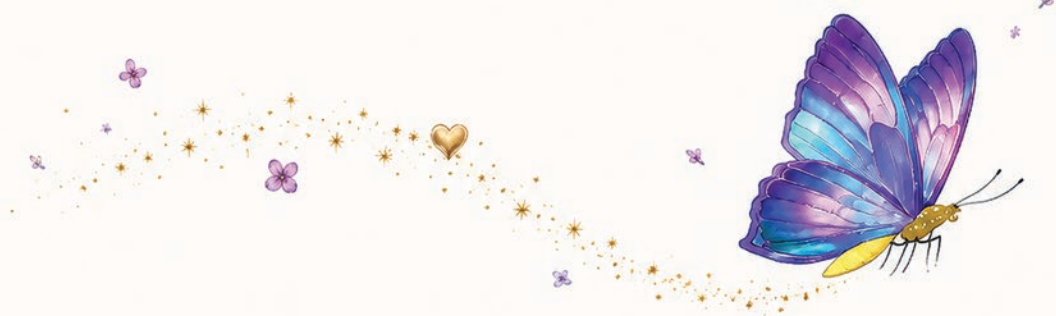

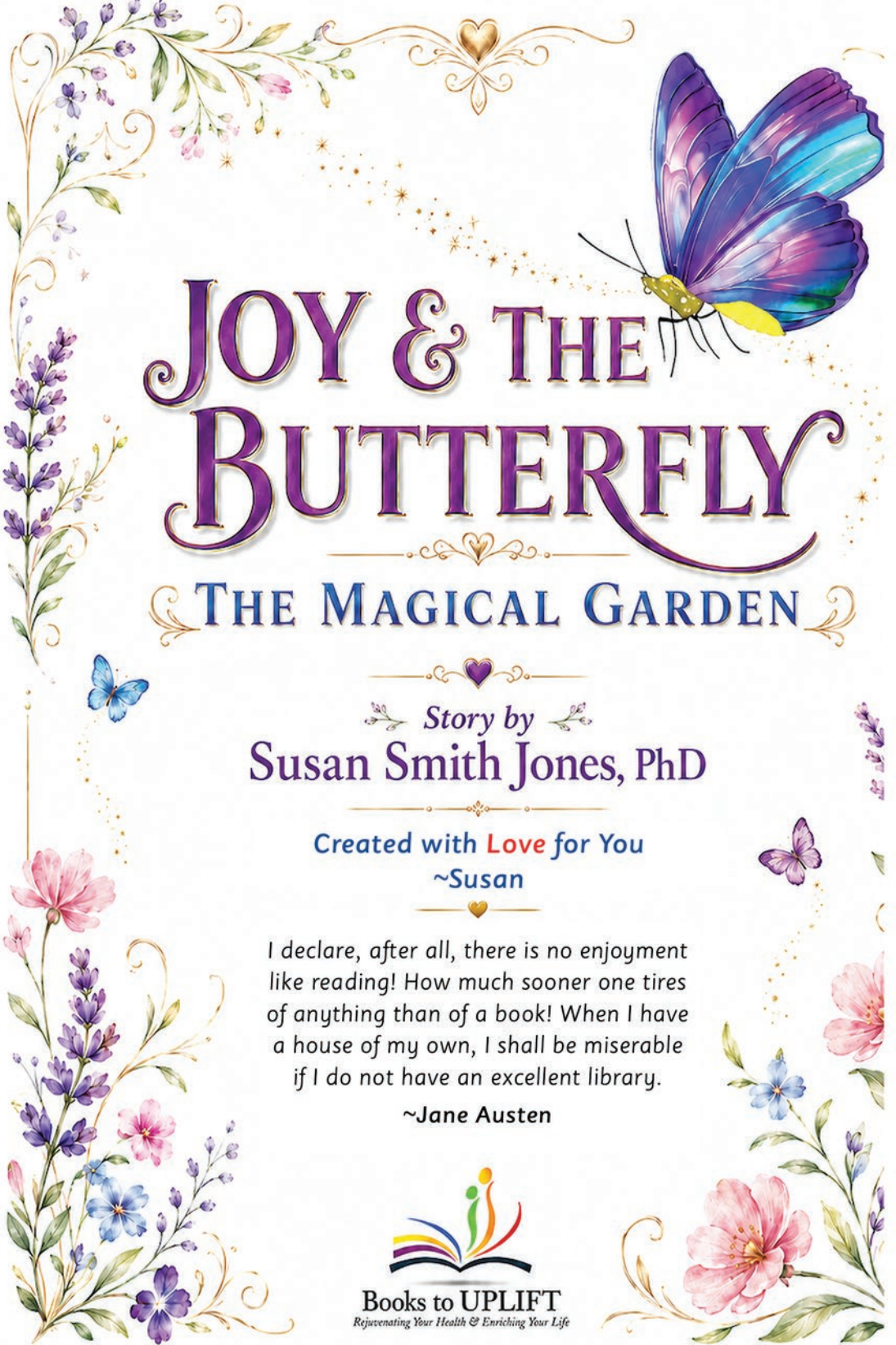

100+ Fun Study Questions & Inquiries for Adults & Everyone

This book is a timeless, magical story about Joy and her butterfly friend who helps guide her through life's challenges and opportunities. Joy's adventures highlight the importance of healthy family interactions, sharing feelings, spending time in nature, being kind to others, focusing on gratitude, overcoming fears, and living by the Golden Rule.

The captivating storylines in this book can be as unique and meaningful to read for you as it is for the child in your life. The life of any reader who takes this journey with Joy will be forever enriched. Children should actively participate in reading to get the most out of this experience. As you read to or along with them, you can spark the child's natural eagerness to learn by asking questions about the illustrations and the adventures. This helps them increase their knowledge, develop essential skills, and achieve a series of successes, which promotes healthy self-esteem and a positive attitude about learning.

With the right questions, you can help build the child's math and reading readiness skills, ability to recognize shapes and colors, powers of observation, and vocabulary while increasing their knowledge and appreciation of nature, family, love, kindness, butterflies, vitality, and more. The illustrations provide the opportunity to formulate questions to nurture these important skills:

Questions like, “What do you see on this page that starts with the letter ‘S’?” facilitate reading readiness. These could be located in the text for your younger kids and in the form of objects for the older kids (for example, the sun, sunflowers, saddle, Sunny, Swifty, and smile).

Questions like, “How many swans do you see in the pond?” and, “How many butterflies or ladybugs do you see on the flowers?” facilitate math readiness. Questions like “What is yellow or blue on this page?” or “What color is the tractor or the puppy?” and “What do you see that is round, rectangular, or triangular?” provide practice for color and shape recognition.

Questions should reflect the developmental level and age of each child. The following are sample questions for many pages to help you engage children of all ages. You can print out these pages to help you in the reading process. Also, be sure to turn it around and let the child question you, too!

While reading skills vary, children ages seven and up can read independently or aloud to others, children ages five to seven can read alongside an adult, and children two to five can be read to. Those under three can look at the illustrations while the adult points out images of interest and tells snippets of the story. In other words, this book will work for the young ones who can’t read yet, for those children who are gifted at reading, and even for the young-at-heart — any adult who wants to be inspired by uplifting and very positive storylines. This book is for everyone. Enjoy!

And, as always, it surely helps to be enthusiastic when reading to children from the books’ pages. Try reading with different voices reflecting the different people and magical characters. If you are enthusiastic, the kids will be, too, and enjoy the storylines even more. Ralph Waldo Emerson once said, “Nothing great was ever achieved without enthusiasm.”

Okay, here we go. Find ways to add in your own questions and inquiries and make it fun!





100+ FUN STUDY QUESTIONS & INQUIRIES FOR ADULTS & EVERYONE



1. **Page 4 — The Garden & Flowing Water:** Where is Poppy, the cardinal, and what color is he? How many bunny rabbits can you find? Point to the heart on the yellow pillow. Can you find Periwinkle, our dragonfly, Twinkles, our hummingbird, and Violet?
2. **Page 5 — Contents:** Point to all the words beginning with the letter “S” and count how many you find. Where is Violet on this page, and what colors are in her wings?
3. **Page 6 — Barn, Tractor & Pastures:** How many windows do you see on the barn? Are these windows shaped like a circle, triangle, or rectangle? What are the three colors you need in the flag of America? Point to both chickens. What shape are the wheels of the tractor? Point to the heart. Do you see any flowing water on this page? What is the three-word name on the barn? How many letters are in the name, and what are these letters?
4. **Page 9 — Joy with Her Three Best Friends Forever (BFF):** What color are Juniper’s eyes (the kitten)? Where is the butterfly, Violet, perched on this page? Can you find a heart in the picture? Can you find a color that matches Joy’s pants in her bedroom? Point to the teddy bear? What name would you give Joy’s stuffed teddy bear if it were given to you?
5. **Page 10 — Joy at the Garden Gates:** Can you locate the heart in the picture? How many butterflies can you find? What kind of bird is watching Joy from his tree perch? Do you know this bird’s name?
6. **Page 14 — Joy & the Caterpillar:** What is inside the glass jar? What will this insect turn into in about two weeks? Does Joy look sad or happy at what she is looking at in the jar? Point to Joy’s right hand.

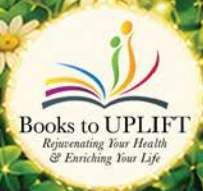
